2007 KyACDA Summer In-Service

The 2007 KY-ACDA Summer Workshop is *the* event of the summer for Kentucky choral directors. Our headliner clinician is **Dr. Z. Randall Stroope**, Director of Choral Studies at the Rowan University in Glassboro, New Jersey. At the national ACDA convention in Miami several of his compositions were performed. His catalog includes both sacred and secular works that are regularly lovely, sensitive settings of worthwhile texts. If you don't know his music—and many of you already do—you'll have an introduction at a reading session that he will lead. He will also rehearse a Director's Chorus so that we can learn from him in action as a choral conductor, and he will lead topical sessions on choral tone and working with adolescent male voices.

Dr. Joy Berger will help us recover perspective amid the flurry of activity that is the norm for a choral director. Joy is a gifted musician who can speak to musicians about the things that are—or should be—most important to us, even including our jobs. Some of you may have been in her session at the National Orff Convention in Louisville a couple of years ago. Her book, *Music of the Soul: Composing Life Out of Loss*, came out last September.

Scott P. Burress will lead a session intended to give middle school directors ideas for where to find music they can do. He is the Director of Choirs for the LaRue County Schools. There he directs five choirs including an Advanced Middle School Girls Chorale and an Advanced High School Girls Chorale. He has been on staff in LaRue County for six years. Scott also is active in the Hardin County arts community by participating and serving as music director for their annual fall musical. He is a soloist for the Mid-Kentucky Arts community choir in Springfield, KY, and a past member of Voces Novae, a community choral group in Louisville. He resides in Elizabethtown, KY, with his cat Cogsworth.

Dr. Gary Anderson is Director of Choral Ensembles at Transylvania University. Not long ago he went to Sweden while on sabbatical to study the choral scene there. Alongside the very contemporary sounds often heard at ACDA conventions, Swedish choirs also have a rich tradition of folk song arrangements and Lutheran church music. His session will include accessible music that your choir may be able to use.

Dr. Randy Pennington is the Director of Choral Studies at Northern Kentucky University, and also Director of Music Ministries at Madeira-Silverwood Presbyterian Church. He will lead a reading session of Christmas music in a wide range of styles. Hey, in July you'll be thinking about December holiday music, right? (Doesn't every choral director?) It will be fun, especially with Randy leading.

This year's workshop will be in **Lexington** at the **Radisson Plaza Hotel**. You can reserve your room by calling (859) 231-9000. We have a special conference rate of \$99 until June 22. My plan is to return the workshop to Louisville in 2008, and see if alternating the site between the two cities will make the workshop accessible to more Kentucky choral directors.

Dr. Z. Randall Stroope

Z. Randall Stroope (b. 1953) is widely known as a conductor, lecturer, and composer. He is the Artistic Director of a summer music festival in England, and frequently conducts in Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Washington National Cathedral and other well-known venues in the United States.

Dr. Stroope conducted choral/orchestral concerts in Vienna and Salzburg last season as part of those cities' 250th Celebration of Mozart's birth. Additional guest conducting has included the American School in Singapore and choir festivals in New York, Texas, Florida, Utah, Illinois, Oregon, Kansas, California, Michigan, and Virginia. Choral groups under his direction have taken 35 national tours and 15 international tours, including China, Japan, Russia, Sweden, the Baltics, Finland, central Europe, England, Canada and South Africa.

He is constantly sought after as a lecturer and guest conductor, headlining summer ACDA conventions in 12 states and conducting 20 All-State choirs.

Dr. Stroope had performing groups on the 1999 ACDA National Convention in Chicago, and the International Society of Music Education in Pretoria, South Africa in 1998. The University of Nebraska Concert Choir under his direction performed on the North Central ACDA Regional Convention in 2004.

Dr. Stroope studied composition with Cecil Effinger and Normand Lockwood, both students of Nadia Boulanger (who was a student of Gabriel Fauré). Stroope has published 80 musical works, and has sold over a million and a half copies of music. He was the ACDA Raymond Brock commissioned composer for 2004, and his commission - "We Beheld Once Again the Stars" was performed at all of the ACDA Regional Conventions in 2004. Of his twelve recorded compact discs - two are of his own music, titled *Passages I & II: The Choral Music of Z. Randall Stroope*.

Z. Randall Stroope is Director of Choral Studies at the prestigious Rowan University in Glassboro, New Jersey, where he directs the RU Concert Choir, Women's Chorus, choral arranging, and conducting. His wife, Cheryl, is a middle school choral music teacher in the area.
